

Mandatory Use of Mask or Face Covering within The Inner Arts Collective

Beginning July 7, 2020, all Members and visitors are required to wear a mask or face covering upon entering and remaining within The Inner Arts Collective. The mask or face covering must cover the nose, mouth and chin.

Temporary removal of the mask is permitted where necessary for the purposes of receiving services, or while actively engaging in a fitness activity.

The following persons are exempted from requiring a mask or face covering and will not be required to provide proof of such exemption:

- Regulated Health Professionals*
- Children under two years of age.
- Persons with an underlying medical condition which inhibits their ability to wear a mask or face covering.
- Persons who are unable to place, remove, or use a mask or face covering without assistance.
- IAC Members in a designed area not for public access, or within or behind a physical barrier.
- Persons who are reasonably accommodated by not wearing a mask or face covering under the Ontario Human Rights Code.

Prior to each client session: Members will ensure their clients have a link to the Inner Arts Collective information page, containing:

- A link to By-Law 541-2020
- Why wearing a mask is important
- Downloadable mask/face covering posters and resources
- An invitation to contact the Member should they have any questions

In addition, prior to each session, Members must clarify with their client if they are exempt or not and remind them to please arrive with a mask if they are not exempt.

Upon arrival: All Members must inform clients of our hand sanitizer at the main entrance. In the event that a customer arrives without a mask because they forgot or don't have one, a mask is available at the front desk for \$2.

This policy has been created in compliance with the City of Toronto By-Law 541-2020.
